

HOCKEY HALL OF FAME LAUNCHES LEGACY OF LEGENDS SWEEPSTAKES \$20,000 GRAND PRIZE / TICKETS AVAILABLE AT HHOFCONTEST.CA

TORONTO (June 23, 2023) – The Hockey Hall of Fame (HHOF) announced today the launch of the *Legacy of Legends Sweepstakes* with net proceeds in support of HHOF's mission to celebrate and grow the game of hockey and to preserve the rich history of Canada's national winter sport.

There will also be weekly draws for a \$500 gift card for the Hockey Hall of Fame online store.

Canadian residents outside of Quebec and over the age of 18 are eligible to purchase tickets at <u>HHOFContest.ca</u>. The weekly draws will take place every Monday at 1:59 PM ET, starting on June 26, 2023. The grand prize and secondary prize winners will be drawn on September 5, 2023, at 1:59 PM ET. As a special offer, when customers purchase \$50 or more in sweepstakes tickets, they will receive 50% off admission for a family or group of four to the Hockey Hall of Fame in downtown Toronto.
